GREETINGS FROM THE DEAN

LECTURESHIP ESTABLISHED

I am pleased with this opportunity to extend to the recent graduates and to the students currently enrolled in the School happy Christmas holiday greetings.

1971-72 was a very satisfactory academic year. Twenty-seven seniors received BLA degrees in June and two graduated at the end of Summer School. Four graduate students were awarded the MLA degree. The 1972 - 73 session is off to a good start with more enrollees than ever before. In fact, the School is functioning at full capacity. Fifth-year seniors and graduate students are housed at the Lucy Cobb Institute building with the remaining four classes in the Landscape Architecture building on main campus.

The School has a top priority for a new building. This long cherished dream for adequate physical facilities designed to function as a School of Environmental Design is long overdue. Applications for admission to the undergraduate and graduate programs steadily increase. The School enjoys a prestige second to none in the world. A new facility, proposed to be located directly East of the present building between the Founders Memorial Garden and the Law School, is a necessity not only to meet current demands but also to provide for future growth and progress in the expanding dynamic field of environmental design education.

The establishment of the ELEANOR FERGUSON VINCENT Lectureship in Landscape Architecture is herewith officially announced. Miss Otey Vincent is the generous donor. For several years the Trust Department of the University Office of Finance has received and invested an annual contribution from Miss Vincent. By July 1, 1973, the fund will have reached \$25,000. The income is to be used for bringing distinguished scholars to the School to serve as lecturer and/or visiting critic.

Mrs. Vincent was born in Nashville, Tennessee, and lived most of her life in Lynchburg, Virginia, before coming to Athens. She was the wife of Thomas Pleasant Vincent, a graduate of the University of Georgia, Class of 1875, who was prominent in the business, civic and social life of Athens. Mrs. Vincent was one of the 12 Founders and a Charter Member of the Ladies Garden Club of Athens, America's first Garden Club.

The Lectureship will be officially launched on the evening of Tuesday, January 16, 1973, Georgia Center for Continuing Education. Edward V. Jones, eminent architect and America's leading expert on the historic preservation of structures and gardens of the Federal and Greek Revival periods in the U.S.A. has been chosen to present the first Vincent Lecture.

International Professional Growth

The most significant progress made in the landscape architecture profession during the past year has been the re-structuring of the organizational and administrative set up of the International Federation of Landscape Architects. At the XIII Biennial Congress held in Brussels last September, it was voted to reorganize into three Regions as follows:

- Eastern - Asia, New Zealand and Australia
- Central - Europe and Africa
- Western- North, Central and South America

The three incumbent IFLA Vice Presidents have been designated to form an organizational structure for the Region. As 1st Vice President, it was my responsibility to serve as Chairman of the Western Region. During October and November I succeeded in getting personnel from IFLA-member American nations to serve in the following capacities:

- Vice Chairman - Venezuela
- Secretary-Treasurer - Mexico
- Advisory Committee Members - One each from Argentina, Brazil, Canada and the United States

The profession is farther advanced in the U.S.A. than in any other American Country with Canada and Venezuela ranking second and third, respectively. It is felt that this new arrangement will provide the medium for more effective communication between the landscape architects of the world, as well as greater opportunity for participation in meetings, conferences and tours. The U.S.A., as leader nation, will have the opportunity to render important assistance to those nations where the profession is only beginning to emerge or is non-existent in guiding the development of educational opportunities, assisting in securing official governmental recognition, and in various other ways.

The first week in May, 1973 will mark completion of 45 years for me with the landscape architecture program at the University. I will retire June 30. I shall continue to live in Athens where I intend to accomplish some writing and handle a limited amount of consultation work. The Annual Landscape Architecture Alumni Conference will be held May 4 and 5. I shall be pleased to see any of you who can arrange to come to Athens at that time.

FACULTY NEWS

DEAN OWENS is a contributing author in the 1972 Yearbook of the U.S. Department of Agriculture entitled "Landscape For Living" published by the U.S. Government Printing Office.

WILLIAM MANN spent 11 weeks of the summer in Europe on a "scavenger hunt to observe, study and photograph those significant historic landmarks which are covered in the history of landscape design course." Bill flew to Rome where he picked up his Fiat and drove south to Naples-Pompeii, then to northern Italy. From there he traveled, via Switzerland, to the Loire Valley of France and to Paris. After two weeks in southern England he returned to Italy via Belgium, Germany and Austria, followed by a week in Yugoslavia touring Roman and Medieval sites. Altogether he spent one month in Rome, seven weeks total in Italy.

ECKART BELOW returned to Sweden at the end of Spring Quarter to his office in Stockholm. One of his major projects concerned the ecological planning and landscape design of a site located on the west coast of Sweden north of Goteburg where a crude oil refinery is under construction. During the summer he attended an international symposium on the environment of the Baltic Sea in Rostock, East Germany and he also attended the IFLA conference in Brussels, Belgium.

JOHN LINLEY attended the Associated Collegiate Schools of Architecture in Aspen, Colorado in June.

WILLIAM E. BEERY was appointed landscape architect to prepare a master plan, working drawings and a planting plan for the University of Georgia Botanical Garden. He assumed his duties July 15, 1972. Graduate students Luke Melton and Jim Tiller are working with Mr. Beery in preparing the plans of the 250 acre tract.

A Fragrance Garden, designed by VINCENT J. BELLAFFIORE, was completed and dedicated in November. Located on the grounds of the Athens Regional Library, the area is to serve as "a garden of fragrances for the blind, an educational facility for teachers and students, a haven for citizens of all ages, and attraction for tourists and a boost for the City of Athens". The garden originated as a class project under the direction of Prof. Robert Hill.

DR. TARIQ M. DURRANI was invited to attend a three-week conference in Athens, Greece from July 3 to 20, 1972. The conference, entitled "1972 Athens Ekistics Month", was the tenth in the series and was convened by the Athens Center of Ekistics and the Doxiadis Associates, Inc. The conference attracted participants and observers from more than twenty countries, and numbered over five hundred persons.

While vacationing in Belgium for about two weeks in August, DR. DURRANI visited several historical towns and cities to see the rich architectural heritage of the country. From Belgium, he went on to visit his home country, Pakistan, to collect information and make first-hand observations of the development of the national capital, Islamabad, under construction since 1961. Dr. Durrani is making a comparative study of Islamabad and Brasilia of Brazil.

ALLEN STOVALL, through funds from three separate grants, is currently engaged in producing a 28 minute 16mm color environmental film which documents the North Georgia-Southern Highlands Region in change. The film seeks to present the impact that recent changes are making - environmentally and on the people of the region. Included in the "package" is a teaching kit, or materials assembled which will help the viewing audience to focus on issues facing their own community offering opportunities for involvement in helping to solve these problems, and to find answers for some of the questions raised in the film. Film input-critique committee serves to provide feedback to Stovall and his two film associates, Barry Jones, Director-cinematographer and Candi Logue, Production Assistant. The film is being funded by grants from the Georgia Mountains Authority, Helen, Georgia; Standard Telephone Company, Cornelia, Georgia; and the Appalachian Regional Commission through the State Office of Planning and Budget.

JOHN C. WATERS was promoted to Associate Professor, July 1, 1972. At the Fall meeting of the Athens-Clarke Heritage Foundation, Mr. Waters was presented with an award by Foundation trustees for his outstanding contribution to historic preservation in Athens and his service to the Foundation as its president for the past five years.

J. BROOKS BREEDEN and his wife, Peggy, hosted the reception of the Georgia Chapter of ASLA at their lovely home on Hampton Court in Athens in December.

JAMES G. GUTHRIE was recipient of the Sarah H. Moss Traveling Fellowship for 1972 and used the stipend to study the Palladian architecture of northern Italy.

CHARLES AGUAR was appointed by Governor Carter as consultant to the staff of the Georgia Heritage Trust Advisory Commission and has assisted in identifying and recommending policies for the protection and management of the most outstanding remaining natural and cultural areas in the state. This involves finding the geological, scenic, and best examples of physiographic regions as well as the historical and archeological sites in the state. At the beginning of Winter Quarter, 1973, he will return to the School for full time teaching.

JAMES M. KNOPF spent the summer working for a multi-discipline landscape architecture firm in Minneapolis and a subsidiary office in Denver. Projects included a major recreation report for Thunderbay, Ontario and an apartment complex in Lakewood, Colorado.

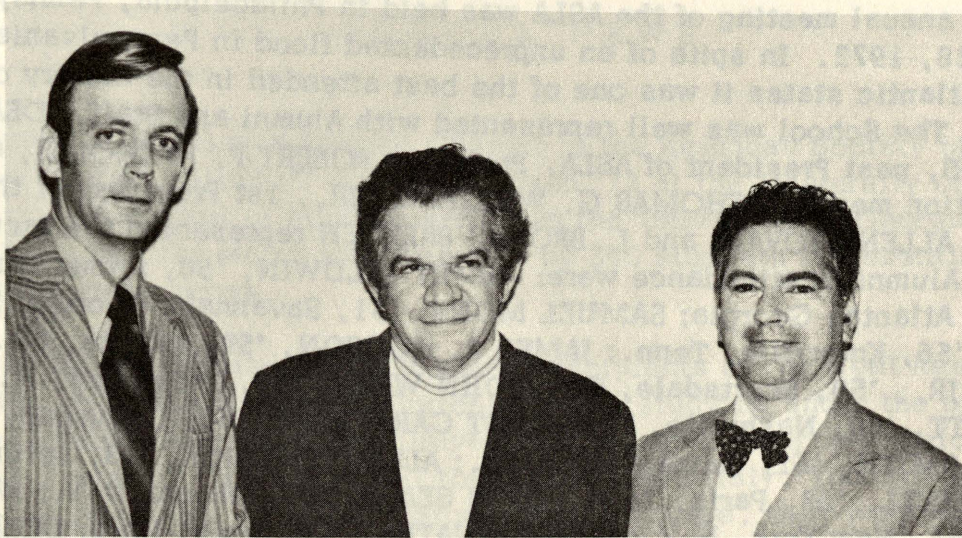

Program highlights were a lecture by Nancy Hanks, Director, National Council on the Arts presented at the final banquet, and a Report on the Profession by Dr. Albert Fein. Tours included visits to Fairmont Park, the Independence Hall and Society Hill section of all Philadelphia, Brandywine, and Longwood Gardens. A number of social occasions provided ample opportunity for informal visits with old friends and new acquaintances. SCHOOL NEWS

As President of the Georgia Student Chapter of the American Society of Landscape Architects, ROBBIE CHESNUT attended Labash '72 at the University of Wisconsin in February. An exhibit of student work from the University of Georgia was on display at the meeting which was attended by 340 students representing 24 schools of Landscape Architecture.

THOMAS R.
