## Black Bears in Georgia

o 3 populations in Georgia --- North Central South

- o GA-SC-NC density of about 1 bear per square mile (640 acres)
- N. GA bears in all or part of 12 counties
  Dawson, Fannin, Gilmer, Habersham, Lumpkin, Murray, Pickens, Rabun, Stephens,
  Towns, Union, White
- o Possible population size (statewide) 2500 bears; 1500 in Mountains
  - Population may be declining due to home development & increased visitation
- o Females den in large trees; males and subadults favor ground dens; good tree climber
- Age at  $1^{st}$  breeding ~ 4 years for female; 1.5 2.5 years for males
  - o Average 2-3 cubs per litter
  - o Breed every 2-3 years
- O Typically 5-6 feet long; weight 125 to 400 pounds
- o Omnivores -- eat whatever is available; opportunistic
  - o Forbs, grass, berries, fruit, acorns & other nuts, animal matter inc. carrion, insects, fish, corn, clover, grain sorghum
- O Home range variable up to 10 sq miles
- Secure food items in locked containers or hang in trees when camping; nuisance complaints increasing especially in spring as young males disperse
- o Harvest 2002–212 bears; 2003 260; 2004 160
