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Invasive Trees of Georgia

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Georgia has many species of trees. Some are native trees and some have been introduced from outside the state, nation, or continent. Most of Georgia's trees are well-behaved and easily developed into sustainable shade and street trees. A few tree species have an extrodinary ability to upsurp resources and take over sites from other plants. These trees are called invasive because they effectively invade sites, many times eliminating other species of plants.

There are a few species native to Georgia which are considered invasive in other parts of the country. These native invasives, may be well-behaved in Georgia, but reproduce and take over sites elsewhere, and so have gained an invasive status from at least one species list. Table 1. Many of trees on the introduced or exotic tree invasives list are notorious for growing rampantly and being difficult to eradicate. Table 2.
